This study employed a descriptive design and qualitative content analysis to examine Begum Sarwari Sadiq's parliamentary performance and political role. Additionally, in-depth interviews were conducted to gain a comprehensive understanding of her social services.

Family Background of Begum Sarwari Sadiq

Begum Sarwari Sadiq was born into a prestigious family of agriculturists, tracing their roots to the esteemed Arain clan, in 1926 or 1927 in Batala, a small town in the Gurdaspur district of India. Her early years were marked by a strong emphasis on education, which led her to pursue her academic aspirations at a local school. She later enrolled at the University of the Punjab, Lahore, where she graduated in 1946, laying the foundation for her future endeavors (Farzana Musaddaq, Personal Communication, August 22, 2024).

As the elder sibling, Begum Sarwari Sadiq had a close bond with her only sister, Begum Anwari Sadiq. The two shared a strong familial tie, which would remain unbroken despite the challenges they faced in their lives. Following the partition of India in 1947, Begum Sarwari Sadiq's family made the arduous journey from Gurdaspur to Faisalabad (then known as Lyallpur), seeking a new beginning in the newly formed nation of Pakistan. They eventually settled in Dasuha, a suburban locality of Faisalabad, where Begum Sarwari Sadiq would go on to make a lasting impact on her community (Farzana Musaddaq, Personal Communication, August 22, 2024).

Mehr Muhammad Sadiq, Begum Sarwari Sadiq's father, was a distinguished lawyer and a leading legal practitioner in district Lyallpur. His expertise in law was matched by his passion for politics, which led him to contest the first general elections held after independence in 1951. His victory in the elections marked the beginning of his illustrious political career, as he became a member of the Provincial Assembly of Punjab in 1951. Mehr Muhammad Sadiq's tenure in the Punjab Assembly lasted until 1955, when the assembly was dissolved to form the Provincial Assembly of West Pakistan (PAP, 1951).

This new assembly brought together representatives from Punjab, Sindh, and the North-West Frontier Province (NWFP), with Mehr Muhammad Sadiq being one of the 15 members elected from district Lyallpur. His reputation as a skilled politician and lawyer earned him a coveted position as Minister of Cooperation in three consecutive cabinets. Mehr Muhammad Sadiq's ministerial tenure began in Dr. Khan Sahib's Cabinet, where he served

from October 14, 1955, to July 16, 1957. He continued in this role under Sardar Rasheed's Cabinet from July 16, 1957, to March 18, 1958, and finally under Nawab Ghazanfer Ali Qazilbash's Cabinet from March 18, 1958, to October 7, 1958 (PAP, 1955).

Throughout his ministerial career, Mehr Muhammad Sadiq exemplified a steadfast dedication to public service, leaving an indelible mark on the political landscape of West Pakistan. His unwavering commitment to the welfare of the people and his unshakeable integrity earned him the respect and admiration of his peers and the general public alike. As Minister of Cooperation, he worked tirelessly to promote the cooperative movement, empowering rural communities and fostering economic development. The impact of his ministerial tenure was far-reaching, with his initiatives and reforms continuing to influence the political and social fabric of the region long after his departure from office. Political Career of Begum Sarwari Sadiq

Begum Sarwari Sadiq, a trailblazing politician, served as a member of the National Assembly of Pakistan twice, from 1985 to 1988 (NAP, 1985), and again from 1988 to 1990 (NAP, 1988), was legacy of enlighten face of Faisalabad which had number of female parliamentarians before Begum Sarwari. Her political journey was a testament to the enlightened spirit of Faisalabad, a city with a rich legacy of women in politics. Faisalabad, formerly known as Lyallpur, had a long history of women actively participating in politics and social affairs, setting a precedent for future generations. Begum Sarwari Sadiq's own political career was built on the foundations laid by these pioneering women. Her leadership and vision continued to inspire women in politics, ensuring that the legacy of Faisalabad's enlightened spirit would endure for generations to come (Anees, 2020).

It was the first boarding school established in Pakistan after independence as well as first ever in Lyallpur but it was nationalized by the government in 1970s (Farzana Musaddaq, Personal Communication, August 22, 2024). The family of Begum Sarwari Sadiq, driven by their commitment to social welfare and education, established The Citizen Foundation (TCF) - a non-profit organization dedicated to transforming the lives of marginalized communities through quality education. With a mission to bridge the educational gap, TCF aimed to provide accessible and affordable education to those who needed it most.

Under the visionary leadership of Musaddaq Zulqarnain, Begum Sarwari Sadiq's son, TCF has achieved remarkable milestones. Since its inception, the organization has successfully established approximately two thousand schools across Pakistan, providing educational opportunities to thousands of students. These schools serve as beacons of hope for marginalized communities, offering a chance for social mobility and a brighter future. One notable example of TCF's impact is the Sarwari Sadiq Campus in Dasuha, a locality near Faisalabad. Named in honor of Begum Sarwari Sadiq's tireless efforts in education and social welfare, this campus stands as a testament to her enduring legacy. The campus provides a supportive learning environment, empowering students to reach their full potential and become active contributors to their communities (TCF, 2024). Through TCF's efforts, Begum Sarwari Sadiq's family continues to uphold her values of compassion, empathy, and service to humanity.
